### HOW TO USE THIS STUDY

Walking In Faith explores what the Bible says about faith. It examines what it means to have faith in God, and how God is faithful toward those who follow Him. The lessons look into the lives of men and women of faith in the Bible, with special focus on the people who are mentioned in Hebrews chapter 11.

This book is divided into 30 two-page lessons. Completing five lessons per week will allow you to finish the study in six weeks. Completing one lesson per week will spread the study out over a school year. The format allows flexibility, however, if you chose to complete more or fewer lessons each week. This study was created using primarily the New American Standard Bible; but effort has been made to make the study usable with a variety of translations, including the New International Version, the King James Version, and the New King James Version.

Younger children may need assistance reading the lessons, writing the verses, and completing the puzzles. Older children will be able to complete the lessons on their own, but parents are encouraged to oversee the study so that the children can gain wisdom from their parents as they look into the Word together.


### FAITH COMES BY HEARING





In Exodus 15:26, God told the Israelites, "I, the Lord, am your healer." When we are sick, God wants us to pray to Him. Sometimes God decides to make sick people well miraculously. When this happens, we should rejoice and praise God. Sometimes God doesn't make sick people well. Sometimes people we love stay sick for a long time. Sometimes their sickness makes them die. When this happens, even though it's hard, we should still rejoice and praise God because He is in control.

Sometimes being sick is a way for us to grow closer to God. Sometimes it is a way for others to see how Christians can still have faith in God even when they are sick. Paul had something wrong with his body. He prayed three times that God would make him better, but God didn't do it. God told Paul that His power is perfected in weakness. The fact that God didn't make Paul well didn't make Paul stop having faith in God. Instead, Paul said that he was glad! He said he was content with weaknesses, insults, distresses, persecutions, and difficulties (see 2 Corinthians 12:7-10). He knew that God loved him and that it was all for the best that he was suffering as he was.



### CLEANSED BY FAITH

At first, almost all of the people who believed in Jesus were Jews. Some of the Jews thought they were the only ones who could be Christians. They thought that Jesus only came to save Jews. They didn't fully understand the message of the Gospel. Jesus didn't come to save only one group of people. He came to save the whole world!

Some of the early Jewish Christians started accepting Gentiles (people who are not Jews) as Christians, but they decided that Gentile Christians needed to follow the Old Testament Jewish law. The apostle Peter tried to help them understand things better. The Gentiles had heard the Gospel preached to them and had believed. God had given the Gentiles the gift of the Holy Spirit, just as He had given the Holy Spirit to the Jewish Christians. Peter said that God made no distinction between different kinds of people. He cleanses the hearts of both Jews and Gentiles by faith (see Acts 15:1-9).


Don't let your heart get dirty. Let God keep it squeaky clean!

### WALKING BY FAITH


Imagine Jesus taking your hand and leading you on a tightrope across the Grand Canyon. Imagine Him saying, "We're going to make it to the other side. Don't be afraid. I won't let you fall." Imagine walking out onto the tightrope. As long as you look at Jesus and follow Him, you know you'll be all right. If you look down, though, and see how far it is to the bottom, you're probably going to get scared. You might say, "Why did You bring me out here? If I fall I'll die!" Jesus knows that if you fall and hit the bottom you'll die, but that's why He's holding your hand! He's not going to let you fall!

In Matthew 14, the disciples were in a boat on a stormy night. Jesus came to them, walking on the water. When the disciples saw Jesus, they were afraid and thought Jesus was a ghost; but Jesus said, "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid." Peter said, "Lord, if it is You, command me to come to You on the water." Jesus told Peter to come. Peter got out of the boat and started walking on the water to Jesus! While he was walking, Peter began to look around. Because it was stormy, he got scared and started to sink. Peter had taken his eyes off Jesus. Peter called to the Lord to save him, and Jesus stretched out his hand and pulled Peter up out of the water, saying, "You of little faith, why did you doubt?" Peter should have known that Jesus wouldn't tell him to come to Him and then let him drown. If Peter had kept his eyes on Jesus, having faith that Jesus would take care of him, he never would have started to sink.

When we walk with the Lord, our focus needs to be on Him. We need to have faith in Him. We shouldn't get afraid or distracted by what we see around us. We need to keep our eyes on Jesus! He will guide us through whatever dangers or hardships come our way.

Some people who are blind use guide dogs to help them get around. The dogs are specially trained to take care of their blind masters and protect them, leading them in safety.

The first guide dog training school in the United States was founded in 1929. It was named The Seeing Eye. The name came from Proverbs 20:12, which says, "The hearing ear, and the seeing eye, the Lord hath made even both of them" (KJV). The Seeing Eye still trains dogs today, and there are now many organizations around the world which offer the same service.




The blind person who receives a guide dog must learn to trust that his dog is going to take care of him and lead him well. The blind person can't see what is ahead of him. He must walk by faith, not by sight.

Take a good look at the silhouette of the dog in the box on the left. Now pick up a pencil and place the point in the box on the right. Close your eyes and try to draw a dog just like the one on the left. Keep your eyes closed! The dog you draw probably won't look a whole lot like the other one, but that's okay! Now ask someone in your family to guide your hand as you trace around the dog on the left. Keep your eyes closed again and trust your guide.

When we can't see the way, things turn out much better when we have a guide. God is our guide. We can't see what's going to happen in the future, but God can, and He will guide us if we trust Him to lead us. We must walk by faith, not by sight.






### SHIELD OF FAITH



Read 1 Timothy 1:18-19 and answer the questions below.









God gives everyone different gifts and opportunities and blessings. We should use all of these for God's honor and glory. When we are faithful in small things, God will trust us with bigger things.




# FULL OF FAITH

Stephen was a follower of **JESUS** who was described in Acts as being full of **FAITH**, full of the Holy **SPIRIT**, full of **GRACE**, and full of **POWER**. Some men who opposed the followers of Jesus started arguing with Stephen, but they couldn't win because Stephen had so much **WISDOM** and the Holy Spirit was speaking through him. The men who opposed Stephen influenced others to oppose him, and Stephen was dragged away and put on trial.

During his trial, Stephen **SPOKE** to the people who were against him. He started with Abraham and talked about many of the people of the Old Testament and events which led to Jesus Christ. The people listening to Stephen got angry. They cried out with a loud voice and covered their ears because they didn't want to hear what Stephen was saying. They rushed toward Stephen in anger and chased him out of the city. Then they began to throw stones at Stephen to kill him. Stephen called on the Lord and said, "Lord Jesus, **RECEIVE** my spirit." Then he asked the Lord not to hold the sin of these people against them. The people kept throwing stones at Stephen, and Stephen died (see Acts chapters 6 and 7).

When we read about people like Stephen, we see what faith is supposed to look like. When Stephen was on trial he could have said, "I don't believe in Jesus anymore," and the people would probably have let him go free. Instead, Stephen stood firm in his faith. His faith in Jesus was so strong that he was willing to die for it.
