
## Lesson 16 The Rhode Island and Carolina Colonies

Read the following paragraphs. Each time you come to a place where there are two words in **BOLD** print, circle the one that belongs.

#### **Rhode Island**

Roger Williams came to **Dover / Boston** from England in 1631. He was invited to be the minister of the church, but he declined because he believed the church needed to break its ties with the **Church of England / Catholic Church**.

Williams was banished from England / Massachusetts in 1635. The next year he bought land from the Powhatan / Narragansett people. He and his companions established Providence, a settlement that became a safe place for people who were suffering religious persecution. This and other settlements joined together and formed Rhode Island / Maryland, which received a royal charter from King Charles II.



In 1663 King Charles II gave six / eight English proprietors a large area of land south of Virginia / Georgia. The colony was named Carolina after the king's father.

Since the geography of this land is so varied, by the early 1700s it was already dividing into distinct northern and southern regions. Most settlements in the north were **large / small**. In the south, people began to establish large plantations. People became wealthy by growing **wheat / rice**, which the English bought for a high price.

The proprietors and their descendants sold their land rights to the **English / Spanish** crown in 1729 and the land became two separate royal colonies: North Carolina and South Carolina.

In 1633 colonists from England / Scotland began a settlement called Middle Plantation. In 1699 it became the capital of Delaware / Virginia and was renamed Williamsburg. Today Williamsburg has over 20 / 120 buildings and is the largest outdoor museum in the world. The House of Burgesses / House of Lords met in Williamsburg's capital building. For a time, they met at the Raleigh Tavern / Peyton Randolph House. The College of William and Mary in Williamsburg was begun in 1693 to train teachers / ministers. America's first theatre / museum was built in Williamsburg in 1716. Virginia's first bakery / newspaper was established there in 1736.

Work to restore Colonial Williamsburg began in **1926** / **1962**. Philanthropist John D. Rockefeller Jr. donated a large amount of **money** / **land** for the project.

On July 1, 1863, a battle between **UNION** and **CONFEDERATE** troops began near the town of Gettysburg, **PENNSYLVANIA**. Confederate forces were winning for the first two days, but on the third day the Union forces gained control and were **VICTORIOUS**. Confederate **GENERAL** Robert E. **LEE** ordered his army to retreat to **VIRGINIA**.

Pennsylvania's **GOVERNOR** agreed to a request made by the people of **GETTYSBURG** to create a proper burial ground for the soldiers who died during the battle. Abraham Lincoln spoke at the dedication of the **CEMETERY** later that year.

Several states have since erected **MONUMENTS** around the battlefield and cemetery to honor their citizens who served in the Civil War. Thousands of people visit Gettysburg National **MILITARY** Park each year. They **REMEMBER** the war and those who died fighting for what they believed to be **RIGHT**.

#### Theodore Roosevelt

Theodore Roosevelt became President after President **McKinley / Wilson** died in office. Roosevelt used his position to help others. He worked for causes he believed in. He helped

Harding, and served in that role until his death in 1930.

In the 1950s, many school children across the country attended schools that were only for white children or only for black children. In **1954 / 1964** the **Supreme / County** Court decided that having these segregated schools was unconstitutional. Schools across the country began to **close / integrate**.

Officials in Little Rock, Arkansas / California , decided to integrate gradually, beginning with the high / elementary school. Five / Nine African American students were chosen to be the first to attend classes at Little Rock Central High. The mayor / Governor of Arkansas did not like the idea of blacks and whites attending the same schools, however, so he called out the National Guard / city gangs to keep the students from attending the school. President Eisenhower / Nixon knew he had to make sure the Constitution was upheld, so he sent members of the 101st Airborne / Marine Division to Little Rock to see that the Little Rock Nine were allowed to go to Central High. Many people in Little Rock agreed with the Governor and didn't want the school to be integrated. They began to riot / move away , but the military personnel worked to maintain order.

Finally classes resumed and the school year progressed. Some of the white students continued to be violent and hateful toward the Little Rock Nine. Some students were suspended or expelled for their behavior. Ernest Green, the only **senior / boy** among the Little Rock Nine, became the first African American to graduate from Central that spring.
