



Look at the photo of the Antarctic penguin family in Lesson 3 to see how to color this picture.




This Middle Eastern boy is flying a colorful kite in the desert. His clothes and headdress are white and his hair is black.




Color this Dead Sea Scroll jar brownish-orange. Color the scrolls beige or light brown.




This bowl is for sale in the Grand Bazaar in Turkey. Color it with bright colors.

Most of the images in this book are based on photographs or images included in the lessons of *Our Great Big World*.

The image of Albert Schweitzer (Lesson 19) is based on the Albert Schweitzer memorial statue in Weimar, Germany. It was sculpted by Gerhard Geyer and dedicated in 1968.

The image of the stained glass window (Lesson 25) is based on a window in the Cathedral of Monaco, which opened in 1903.

The image of Jutta and Lanzelot (Lesson 33) is based on a 15th-century painting from the Burg Eltz in Germany.
