## Unit 4

[ 1 sheet of craft foam, $9^{\prime \prime} \times 12^{\prime \prime}$ or larger (available at craft stores)

$\square$ scrap cardboard (such as the side of a cereal box, cut to $81 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 11^{\prime \prime}$ )
$\square$ black non-toxic craft paint

- sponge paintbrush
$\square$ heavy $81 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 11^{\prime \prime}$ paper or cardstock
$\square$ heavy book ( $81 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 11^{\prime \prime}$ or larger, covered in waxed paper to keep it clean)
- newspaper
$\square$ paper plate or bowl


## Unit 5

$\square 2$ square pieces of craft wood, approximately $6^{\prime \prime} \times 6^{\prime \prime} \times 1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ (available at craft stores)
■ 12 strips of craft wood, approximately $3 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 8^{\prime \prime} \times 1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ inches (ruler-shaped)
$\square$ ruler
$\square$ wood or craft glue
$\square$ black permanent marker
$\square$ herbal tea of your choice and cookies

## Unit 6

- 3 colors of polymer clay (the kind that can be baked)
$\square 1$ felt rectangle ( $9^{\prime \prime} \times 12^{\prime \prime}$ ) in any color
$\square$ scissors
