Family Activity Supply List

Unit 1: Worldwide Dinner

- 3 or 4 pieces of white cardstock taped together (for a table runner)
- markers, crayons, and/or colored pencils
- groceries for dinner
- index cards

Unit 2: A Really Big Boat

For this activity, you will use your vehicle to measure 450 feet and a tape measure to measure 75 feet.

Unit 3: Family Artifacts Album

For this activity, you will take photos of your family members, pets, and aspects of your daily life. You will put them into an album and use pens, pencils, colored pencils, or whatever you want to decorate it.

Unit 4: Sticky Bricks Stonehenge

- 6 tablespoons butter, plus extra to grease pans
- 80 large marshmallows (two 10-ounce packages) OR 8 cups minimarshmallows
- 12 cups crispy rice cereal
- wax paper

Unit 5: Carthaginian Traders Game

- heavy paper (cardstock, preferably in two different colors)
- playing cards (available to print at notgrass.com/a2ulinks)
- 1 die

Unit 6: An Album of Prophets

- paper (cardstock or another high-quality paper if possible)
- tools for writing and drawing (pencil, colored pencils, crayons, markers, ink, etc.)

Unit 7: Aesop Has the Fox to Tea

For this activity, your family will act out a drama. You can use some simple costumes and props if you wish.

Unit 8: Spices of the World Map

- various herbs and spices from your pantry
- world map approximately 8.5"x11", printed on cardstock if possible (available at notgrass.com/a2ulinks)
- piece of corrugated cardboard larger than world map (approximately 17"x19", or as large as possible)
- glue stick
- pins
- yarn or string
- white school glue
- black pen or fine-tip marker

Unit 9: Life of Jesus Timeline

- several white index cards
- Bible
- pens, markers, colored pencils, etc.
- clear mailing tape
- purple or gold ribbon or cord shoebox lid

Unit 10: Roman Mosaic

- 1 piece of posterboard in the color of your choice
- construction paper in the colors of your choice, torn into small pieces, none larger than 1/2-inch square
- pencil
- glue stick

Unit 11: Family Story Obelisk

- thin cardboard (such as a cereal box)
- scissors
- ruler
- pens, fine-tip markers, and/or colored pencils
- tape
- paper plate
- white school glue

Unit 12: Silk Road Trader's Bread

- 1 teaspoon yeast (instant or active dry)
- 1 1/2 cups warm water
- 4 1/2 cups all-purpose flour, plus extra for sprinkling
- 1 1/2 teaspoons salt
- 4 tablespoons melted butter
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- large mixing bowl
- whisk
- plastic wrap
- large sturdy spoon
- knife
- rolling pin (optional)
- two dish towels
- fork
- saltshaker

Unit 13: Maya Relief Carvings

- paper and pencil
- baking soda clay (baking soda, corn starch, water)
- sturdy paper plate with sides (or shoe box lid)
- tools for carving

Unit 14: Northern Lights in Iceland

- white construction paper (you can also use white watercolor paper, cut to size)
- sponge or sponge paintbrush
- watercolor paint in green, blue, and purple (the cheap tray type of watercolor works fine!)
- paper cup
- table salt in saltshaker
- black construction paper
- colored chalk
- glue stick

Unit 15: A Priceless Collection of Chinese Porcelain

- yardstick or tape measure
- 1 sheet white posterboard
- 1 sheet black posterboard
- scissors
- glue stick
- pencils
- blue acrylic paint
- paint brushes

- drawing tools

Unit 17: Coral Reef Art

- large piece of cardboard
- styrofoam pieces (we used cones and spheres)
- pasta in various shapes
- glue (white glue, craft glue, and hot glue are possibilities)
- pipe cleaners (also known as chenille stems or fuzzy sticks)

Unit 18: Making Paper

- paper torn into small pieces, none larger than one-inch square
- blender
- large plastic embroidery hoop (10 inches in diameter is a good size)
- tulle (a fine mesh fabric)
- old towels

Unit 19: Creation Collage

- white posterboard
- colored paper
- various art media of your choice

Unit 20: Silver Coins of Potosi

- 30-35 small paper cups
- 12-oz bag chocolate chips
- saucepan and metal mixing bowl OR microwave-safe bowl
- aluminum foil
- pencil

Unit 21: Old World New World Cookbook

- card stock
- paper
- pens, markers, colored pencils, etc.
- binding for pages (suggestions follow)
- ingredients to prepare one or more recipes featuring rice, corn, wheat, sorghum, potatoes, cassava (tapioca), sweet potatoes, chocolate, coffee, sugarcane, or tea (We have recipe suggestions on page FA-44 in Part 2.)

- white card stock

Unit 23: A Musical Evening
