Pronunciation Guide

Hyphens divide words into syllables. Emphasize syllables written in all capital letters.

Pronounce vowels with a line over them as long vowels:

ā as in acorn, ē as in evil, ī as in ice, ō as in over, ū as in flute.

Pronounce vowels with a curl over them as short vowels:

ă as in apple, ě as in elementary, ī as in idiom, ö as in on, ü as in under.
